Supervisor Behling opened the regular Town Board meeting at 7:06 with the Pledge of Allegiance.

Resolution 2021-89 Approve November Minutes

A motion was made by Councilor Partrick and seconded by Councilor Robert to approve the following resolution. The motion was adopted by a vote of 5 ayes Behling, Barber, Greenway, Partrick, and Robert, and 0 nays.

Reports:

Town Clerk/Water Clerk - A motion was made by Councilor Robert and seconded by Supervisor Behling to accept the November town clerk/water clerk reports as presented. The motion was adopted by a vote of 5 ayes Behling, Barber, Greenway, Partrick, Robert and 0 nays.

<u>Dog Control Officer</u>- A motion was made by Councilor Greenway and seconded by Councilor Partrick to accept the November dog control report as presented. The motion was adopted by a vote of 5 ayes Behling, Barber, Greenway, Partrick, Robert and 0 nays.

Zoning Officer / Building Inspector —A motion was made by Councilor Partrick and seconded by Councilor Robert to approve the report as presented. The motion was adopted by a vote of 5 ayes Behling, Barber, Greenway, Partrick, Robert and 0 nays.

<u>Highway Superintendent</u> – Marsden said he expects to receive fire system quotes as per the NYMIR recommendation next month.

A motion was made by Councilor Robert and seconded by Councilor Greenway to approve the report as presented. The motion was adopted by a vote of 5 ayes Behling, Barber, Greenway, Partrick, Robert and 0 nays.

<u>Community Park</u> – Diehl said he has a lead on fencing for the bleachers as per the NYMIR recommendation.

A motion was made by Councilor Greenway and seconded by Supervisor Behling to approve the report as presented. The motion was adopted by a vote of 5 ayes Behling, Barber, Greenway, Partrick, Robert and 0 nays.

Mexico Point Park — Chepko-Sade said she has finished the grant proposal for the accessible waterfront trail and gave the board members a copy of the budget sheet. Chepko-Sade requested \$2,000 from the park's operational budget and a letter specifying the availability of funds. Councilor Partrick shared that the street light at the park has been fixed and is very bright. Supervisor Behling shared a message from Bond that the caretaker cottage furnace was fixed and is now working; parts of the split rail fence will be replaced; Suburban Propane will be replacing the old propane tank.

A motion was made by Councilor Greenway and second by Councilor Robert to approve the report as presented. The motion was adopted by a vote of 5 ayes Behling, Barber, Greenway, Partrick, Robert and 0 nays.

<u>Planning</u> – Weber shared the status of a sawmill site plan approval and the RIC solar project. Weber said the Planning Board is reviewing the property for the solar project and interfacing with Oswego County Soil & Water for assistance with map reviews, interpretations, and discussions with RIC at Planning Board meetings. Weber said the charges are paid by the applicant. Weber said the County Planning Board has concerns about water. Seiter said he would contact RIC to notify them of the Planning Board meeting on January 5, 2021.

A motion was made by Councilor Partrick and second by Councilor Robert to approve the report as presented. The motion was adopted by a vote of 5 ayes Behling, Barber, Greenway, Partrick, Robert and 0 nays.

<u>Zoning</u> – Waterbury said the ZBA has approved two special permits for sawmills, deemed 3 applications incomplete, and tabled one application.

A motion was made by Councilor Greenway and second by Supervisor Behling to approve the report as presented. The motion was adopted by a vote of 5 ayes Behling, Barber, Greenway, Partrick, Robert and 0 nays.

<u>Water Commissioner</u> – Supervisor Behling read the water report. The village has finished flushing all the town's hydrants and two major leaks have been fixed.

A motion was made by Councilor Robert and seconded by Councilor Greenway to accept the report as presented. The motion was adopted by a vote of 5 ayes Behling, Barber, Greenway, Partrick, Robert and 0 nays.

<u>Supervisor</u> – A motion was made by Councilor Greenway and seconded by Councilor Partrick to approve the November supervisor's reports as presented. The motion was adopted by a vote of 5 ayes Behling, Barber, Greenway, Partrick, Robert and 0 nays.

Diehl shared the quote he received from Syracuse Advanced Security Systems for a surveillance system for the Community Park. Diehl said remote access to a life feed could be added to the system. Councilor Greenway asked Diehl to try to obtain a second quote from another company. Diehl said he would try.

A motion was made by Councilor Greenway and seconded by Supervisor Behling to table the matter until the year-end meeting later in the month. The motion was adopted by a vote of 5 ayes Behling, Barber, Greenway, Partrick, Robert and 0 nays.

WHEREAS, pursuant to Article 8 of the Environmental Conservation Law and the regulations contained in 6 NYCRR Part 617 adopted pursuant thereto by the Department of Environmental Conservation of the State of New York, hereafter SEQRA, the Town Board must determine whether such proposal may have a "significant effect on the environment" and therefore require the preparation of an environmental impact statement; and

WHEREAS, to aid the Town Board in determining whether the proposal may have a significant impact upon the environment, a short environmental assessment form (SEAF) has been prepared, a copy of which was presented and circulated at the Town Board's October 11, 2021 meeting; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Part 617, the Town Board has examined the EAF in order to make a determination as to the potential environmental significance of the proposal; and

WHEREAS, the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation (hereafter "NYSDEC") and the New York State Department of Health (hereafter "NYSDOH") and the Town of Mexico are the involved agencies as that term is defined in 6 (A2) NYCRR Section 617.2(t); and

WHEREAS, no further review is required under SEQRA:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Town Board of the Town of Mexico as follows:

- Based on its examination of the EAF, the criteria set forth in Sections 617.11 and 617.6 of the regulations, and such further investigation as the Town Board has deemed appropriate, no potential significant adverse impacts are known;
- Consent to proceed with the project will not cause a significant impact on the environment, and the Town Board will not require the preparation of an environmental impact statement;

- 3. A negative declaration is to be prepared; and
- 4. The Town Clerk of the Town of <u>Mexico</u> is hereby directed to cause to be filed and circulated the negative declaration in accordance with the requirements of SEQRA, a copy of the negative declaration shall be maintained in the Office of the Town Clerk in a file that will be readily accessible to the public, and the clerk shall mail copies, return receipt requested, to:
